2013 Air Service Overview

- Airlines offered little to no growth in seat capacity and produced overall strong revenues and profits
- Reagan National expected to reach an all-time record 20.4 million passengers
- International air service grew at Dulles International for a sixth straight year
- Dulles domestic air service declined primarily due to Reagan National drawing flights/passengers from Dulles



Total Passengers at Reagan National (in millions)



American Airlines

- American and US Airways now approved to merge on December 9, 2013 and begin integrating operations in 2014
- DOJ Settlement requires:
 - ✓ New American will divest 52 roundtrips at Reagan National
 - ✓ 8 leased roundtrips will be sold to JetBlue permanently
 - √ 44 roundtrips are to bundled and sold in at least two bundles/carriers with expectations that it could be more than two bundles/carriers
 - ✓ Likely acquirers: JetBlue, Southwest, Virgin America, Frontier, Alaska, Spirit, other LCCs
 - Congressional interest for bundles to be open to all carriers (Delta, United) to ensure service to small/non-hub communities

2013 Dulles Air Cargo Developments



Ethiopian Airlines' flower imports tonnage almost doubled in 2013 with 3 to 4 import shipments per week – installed additional 40' Cold Storage Container at Dulles Airport dedicated for flowers only




Dulles Airport Cargo Buildings leased at 97%



Increased Textile/Garment import tonnage over 50% from Middle East/Southeast Asia due to Middle East Cargo Sales Mission Tour

United Opens New Wide-Body Maintenance Hangar At Dulles in 2013







- → New \$45 million 125,000 square-foot facility allows United to perform maintenance overnight and get aircraft back into service increasing flexibility and reliability
- → Hangar can accommodate up to two widebody aircraft, such as Boeing 777s (or newest addition—787) plus one narrow-body plane



Proposed 2014 Strategic Targets

- Preserve and increase domestic nonstop services at Dulles International
- Further grow international services at Dulles International
- Focus on smart growth at Reagan National as newly merged American Airlines divests slots
- → Intensify strategic focus on Dulles air cargo development
